y journey in medicine has been driven by a passion for patient care, a commitment to advancing medical knowledge, and a deep desire to empower others, particularly women in medicine. My clinical foundation was built during my medical school training at the University of Ibadan and further reinforced with two residency trainings across two continents and finally becoming board certified in family medicine.

Beyond the clinics, I've always been drawn to research, where I contributed to studies on breast and cervical cancer, menopause and malaria in pregnancy. I pursued a Master in Public Health from the University of Alabama in Birmingham, USA, and the prestigious Sparkman Global Health Fellowship. These experiences instilled in me the importance of evidence-based practice and the pursuit of innovative medical solutions necessary for addressing critical public health challenges in Africa. My passion extends beyond research, global health, and even clinical medicine. This is because at some point in this ambitious career journey, I became isolated and burnt out and began searching for support and encouragement online. However existing support groups didn't address my reality as a Nigerian female doctor with an African residency training background. I found myself constantly bringing my own chair to tables where I didn't quite belong. As a Nigerian female doctor, my story—my African residency, my migrant journey, my career aspirations—was unique. So, I built my own table, crafted from fine African Mahogany, and invited ambitious, like-minded African physicians to join me, creating a community where we truly belong, so that together, we can explore, discuss and connect based on issues that affect us as African physician migrants needing support to practice abroad. I could also equip younger colleagues with the tools I acquired and teach them how to pursue their goals intentionally. I launched the Excellence in Medicine Ladies Network (EIM) in 2020, actively seeking opportunities to empower young African women in medicine. Since then, I've been privileged to connect with remarkable female physicians who share their inspiring journeys and offer invaluable mentoring. I've also met countless ambitious medical students and graduates needing direction on navigating their unique journeys in medicine. I'm honored to serve as the bridge connecting these

EIM leverages on my close to 20 years of global medical experience in diverse environments and from a lifetime immersed in medicine—as the daughter, wife, sister, and in-law of dedicated physicians to support the medical journey of any ambitious woman in medicine. This unique perspective, combined with my unwavering commitment to women's empowerment and medical education reform has been a powerful tool for our success as a leading global network, and the journey has just begun.

EIM is now a leading global network dedicated to supporting these women at every stage of their careers, from medical school to leadership positions. Here, we provide resources, opportunities, support, and most importantly, mentorship, to help them overcome the unique barriers they face in personal growth, career advancement, and achieving global impact. Our vision is to equip these physicians to not only excel in their careers but also to provide sustainable healthcare solutions for Africa through community impact and economic development, thereby building lasting legacies in their profession.

Vice Chancellor, Lagos State University

he obtained a Postgraduate Diploma in Theology from the Bible College of the Redeemed Christian Church of God in the year 2001 and a Postgraduate Diploma in Education PGDE from Lagos State University in 2018. In the year 2012, Professor Olatunji-Bello attended Course 34 of the National Institute for Policy and Strategic Studies Kuru, the highest policy advisory body of the Federal Government, as a nominee of the National Universities Commission NUC where she was awarded the certificate as a Member of the National Institute (MNI).

She was awarded a fellowship of the Physiological Society UK in the year 2017, which was shortly followed by the Fellowship award of the Physiological Society of Nigeria. She was appointed a Fellow of the Society for Environmental Toxicology and Pollution Mitigation in the year 2019. In August 2022, she was honored with an Honorary Fellowship of the Nigeria Psychology Association (NPA) and in January 2023, she was elected a Fellow of the Society of Educational Administrators of Nigeria (FSEA). Also in 2023, she was conferred with a Fellow of the National Labour Institute, and in the same year, she was conferred with a Fellow of the Society for Peace Studies and Practice (FSPSP).

She is the winner of the National Productivity Order of Merit (NPOM) Award conferred by the former President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, Muhammadu Buhari, in May 2023.

An astute academic, Professor Olatunji-Bello rose through the ranks from Assistant Lecturer (1988 to 1991) to Lecturer II (1991 to 1996), Lecturer I (1996 to 1999), Senior Lecturer (1999 to 2005) and Associate Professor (2005 to October 1, 2007), all in the College of Medicine of the University of Lagos, Idiaraba. She assumed duty as the First Professor of Physiology at Lagos State University College of Medicine on the 2nd of October, 2007.

Prof. Ibiyemi Olatunji-Bello has held several professional and administrative positions both at UNILAG and Lagos State University (LASU). Until she was elected the First female Deputy Vice Chancellor of the Lagos State University (LASU).

She is an ordained deaconess in the Baptist denomination, Dr. Ige has been actively involved in her church community. She chairs the Medical Committee of Shalom Baptist Church Akowonjo, a role she has fulfilled since 2002. Her service extends to coordinating medical screening programs and outreach activities in partnership with community-based organizations, faith-based groups, and non-governmental organizations.





STEP 4: RAISE YOUR

RAISE YOUF YOUR RIGH STARTING FI FEEL FOR AN



THE THREE MIDDLE FINGERS OF UR BREAST IN SMALL CIRCLES, PRKING TOWARDS THE NIPPLES. THE BREAST AND THE ARMPIT.



STEP 5:

GENTLY SQUEEZE EACH NIPPLE AND LOOK FOR A DISCHARGE REPEAT ALL THESE STEPS IN RIGHT BREAST.



STEP 6:

REPEAT STEPS 4 AND 5 WHILE LYING ON YOUR BACK WITH YOUR ARM OVER YOUR HEAD. PRESS YOUR BREAST IN THE SAME CIRCULAR MOTION DESCRIBED EARLIER.
